



# Students Discussing the Future of Euro



We would like to invite you to an English language workshop organized jointly by Antall József Centre of Advanced Learning and the Society of Young Autonomous Economists (FAKT) about the present and the prospects of the Euro. Within the workshop students will have the opportunity to express their professional opinion on the topic of the future of European currency.

## **Course of the competition**

Each team may choose a presentation topic (discussed and synchronized with the organizers until the 20th of November, to avoid several competitors in the same issue) presented in English during the workshop from 10 to 15 minutes.

The topic should refer to the present or prospects of the Euro and the problems of the unified currency zone.

Choosing the topic we recommend to bring the issue into focus to have the opportunity of presenting the chosen part of the problem thoroughly, in an adequate and exacting manner.

A team should consist of a maximum of 3 students.

Each team present their results and views in the presence of other competitors and the professional jury membering Zoltán Pitti, researcher of Corvinus University Budapest, ex-president of the APEH; Ágnes Csermely, Head of Department of Monetary Strategy and Economic Analysis of MNB; István Madár, Chief Analyst of Portfolio.hu; and Dr. Gábor Pörzse, President of Board of Trustees of Antall József Centre of Advanced Learning.

## **Award**

A member of the winner team going to have the opportunity to make a speech at the Conference (on which the German Minister of Finance and the finance ministers of Visegrád Four take part as well) on the 5th of December, on behalf of the economist students of Budapest. In addition, the winner team wins a trip to Brussels (visiting the main institutions of the European Union, as the Parliament, the Commission and NATO) organized by the Antall József Centre of Advanced Learning.

## **Roundtable**

After the presentations, a member from each team has the opportunity to join the discussion of the presented topics, and try to find a solution to the emerged issues in a panel discussion. The roundtable is not the part of the competition; it's aim is to work up the unified view of the students, and to collect the relevant and controversial issues for the conference on the 5th of December. After the workshop each team prepares a summary of their results, broadened with the new ideas and perspectives.
